FRESH STRAWBERRY PIE DESSERT

Crust:

1/2 cup melted butter

- 1 cup flour
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup finely chopped pecans
- Strawberry Filling:
- 2 egg whites, at room temperature (pasteurized eggs recommended as they will not be cooked in this dessert)
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 cups chopped fresh strawberries
- 2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 1 cup whipping cream
- Fresh strawberries and sweetened

whipped cream, to garnish (optional) Preheat oven to 350°. Place flour, brown sugar, chopped pecans and melted butter into a bowl and mix well. Pat into the bottom of a 9" x 13" pan.

Bake for 20 minutes or till lightly browned. Cool to room temperature.

Combine egg whites, sugar, berries and lemon juice in the bowl of a stand mixer. Beat for 8-10 minutes till whipped and stiff.

In another bowl, whip the cream until firm peaks form. Fold into strawberry mixture, then spread over the crust. Freeze for at least 6 hours before serving. Remove from freezer about 10 minutes before serving.

Slice into squares and garnish with a dollop of whipped cream and berries, if desired.

PARMESAN ROASTED CAULIFLOWER

8 oz. cauliflower florets, sliced horizontally 2 tablespoons melted butter

1 tablespoon olive oil Pinch of salt 3 dashes of ground black pepper ½ cup Parmesan cheese

1 teaspoon chopped parsley leaves

Preheat oven to 400°. Toss the sliced cauliflower with the butter and olive oil. Season with salt and black pepper.

Transfer the cauliflower to a baking sheet, in single layer, roast until almost tender about 20-30 minutes. Remove from the oven and sprinkle the grated Parmesan and chopped parsley leaves on top of the cauliflower, roast again until the cheese melts and slightly crusty, about 5 minutes. Remove from oven and serve immediately.

PARMESAN BAKED CHICKEN NUGGETS

- 2 boneless, skinless chicken breasts, approximately 1 lb.
- 1¼ cup panko, bread crumbs
- ¹/₃ cup grated Parmesan
- ¹/₄ teaspoon coarse salt
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- ¹/₃ cup all-purpose flour
- 2 large eggs, lightly beaten
- cooking spray
- Spicy Ketchup Dipping Sauce:
- 1/4 cup ketchup
- 3 tablespoons Sriracha or any spicy chili sauce
- 2 tablespoons mayonnaise

Combine all the ingredients for the Spicy Ketchup Dipping Sauce and chill.

Preheat oven to 400°. Cut the chicken into 2-inch pieces. Set on a dish.

Spread panko in a thin layer on rimmed baking sheet and bake for about 3 minutes in the middle rack, until light brown. Transfer the panko to a shallow dish and mix in the Parmesan and coarse salt. Drizzle the oil and mix well.

Set out the flour and eggs in separate dishes. Increase the oven temperature to 450°. Place a wire rack on the baking sheet, lightly coat with cooking spray.

In small batches, coat the chicken in flour, shaking off any excess, dip in egg, and lastly coat well with panko. Transfer to the rack. Bake the chicken until desired tenderness, about 12-14 minutes, turning when halfway through. Serve nuggets with the Spicy Ketchup Dipping Sauce.

OVEN FRIED GREEN BEANS

- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil 2 teaspoons minced garlic
- 1 egg, beaten
- ¹/₂ teaspoon garlic salt
- 12 ounces fresh green beans
- ¹/₃ cup grated Parmesan cheese
 - Preheat oven to 425 degrees. In a large

bowl whisk the oil, garlic, egg and salt together.

Toss in the green beans and coat well.

Sprinkle in Parmesan on the green beans and toss gently.

Place evenly on a greased baking sheet. Bake for 12-15 minutes or until golden. To crisp, heat for a minute or two under broiler.

SUMMER CORN SALAD

- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 tablespoons fresh lime juice
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- 2 cups corn kernels or 3 ears corn, boiled or grilled
- 3 plum tomatoes, seeded and diced
- 2 scallions, finely chopped
- 1 small red onion, diced
- Chopped parsley, for garnish

In a large bowl, whisk together olive oil and fresh lime juice. Season with salt and pepper to taste.

Add remaining ingredients to the bowl and toss until well combined. Let sit for at least 30 minutes. Serve cold or at room temperature.

SOUTHERN CHICKEN SALAD WITH STRAWBERRIES

26 oz. carved chicken breast 1 head Boston or other soft lettuce ½ cup sliced almonds

- 1 pint fresh strawberries, sliced
- 4 tbsp. crumbled blue cheese
- ¹/₂ cup bottled balsamic vinegar salad dressing

In a large bowl, toss lettuce with 4 tablespoons balsamic dressing.

Divide lettuce evenly onto 4 plates. Top with sliced almonds, strawberries, chicken, and blue cheese. Drizzle salad with remaining 4 tablespoons of dressing and serve.

BLUEBERRY WATERMELON FETA MINT SALAD

2 oz. olive oil

1 oz. balsamic vinegar

1/2 teaspoon salt

- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- ¹/₄ cup finely diced red onion
- 8 cups diced watermelon
- 2 cups fresh blueberries
- 1/4 cup rough chopped fresh mint leaves
- 1/2 cup crumbled feta cheese
 - (or more if you like!)

In a large bowl, whisk together olive oil, balsamic vinegar, salt, pepper and diced red onion.

Add the diced watermelon, blueberries, mint and feta cheese to bowl. Gently toss to coat.
