

### Mary's Assumption Into Heaven: Our Journey With Her

My dear Friends,

When I was a youngster, August seemed to be one of those months that I looked forward to because it was the time of the year to prepare for our family vacation that took place on the last week of the month and ended on Labour Day. I remember my Dad always making sure that the tires were rotated, the oil changed, and getting the car tuned up for the adventure. My Mom made sure that the clothes were packed, had a picnic lunch prepared for the journey that then seemed so very long to take, and the pastries baked for the relatives that we were about to visit. The annual trip was to Niagara Falls, Ontario, where my Baba's youngest sister lived with her retired husband.

Initially my great uncle immigrated to the United States from Slovakia and came to Youngstown but working in the steel mills did not interest him. So he settled in Niagara Falls with some of his friends where he found employment with the Cynamid Company, worked very hard, and eventually had enough money saved to bring my great aunt and their three children to Canada from their native Slovakia. By the time I got to know that part of my mother's side of the family, their oldest daughter, Mary, had passed away in childbirth, their older son was married and had a daughter and their youngest son had moved to Toronto with his work. While we were at my great aunt and uncle's home, we would help out with some of their repairs, go to daily Mass, and on the Sunday before Labour Day, we would travel to Galt, Ontario where the Slovak Jesuits would have their annual retreat day (odpust). In those years, I would jog daily from my relative's home down to the area of the Falls and be impressed my its magnificence in the quiet dawn hours.

But the part of the vacation that I enjoyed the most was traveling by car to and from our vacation destination. Our family was together for the almost five hour drive and I would like to gaze out the window seeing the differences in landscapes from the city of Youngstown to the farmlands of northeastern Ohio and northwestern Pennsylvania. The vineyards of Lake Erie in Pennsylvania and New York would exude the rich aroma of the grapes that were almost ready to be harvested. Eventually we would come to Buffalo and cross over to Ontario via the Peace Bridge going through the ritual of being questioned by the Canadian immigration authorities. After that, we would drive along the river connecting Lake Erie to the Falls, stopping on the way to have our picnic lunch. In retrospect, I have a fondness of the simple gifts that I enjoyed along the way.

Our Christian lives are journeys of faith, the faith that has been given to us by Jesus Christ and built on the foundation of the apostles. All of us are called to practice this faith through our thoughts, words and actions that make us worthy to reach the final destination of our journey of faith, namely our union with God in heaven. The model for us in reaching this destination is given to us in the person of the mother of Jesus, the Blessed Virgin Mary. Her solemnity that we celebrate this month exemplifies for us the final destiny and its culmination of faith in the glorification of our bodies and souls to the perfection set forth for us originally in the creation of man and woman.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church declares that Mary's role model for the Church. "In a wholly singular way she cooperated by her obedience, faith, hope, and burning charity in the Savior's work of restoring supernatural

life to souls. For this reason she is a mother to us in the order of grace". (968) The Church teaches that "This motherhood of Mary in the order of grace continues uninterruptedly from the consent which she lovally gave at the Annunciation and which she sustained without wavering beneath the cross, until the eternal fulfillment of all the elect. Taken up to heaven she did not lay aside this saving office but by her manifold intercession continues to bring us the gifts of eternal salvation. . . . Therefore the Blessed Virgin is invoked in the Church under the titles of Advocate, Helper, Benefactress, and Mediatrix." (969)

In 1950, Pope Pius XII solemnly declared that Mary assumed into heaven body and soul in his apostolic constitution entitled Munificentissimus Deus. The Holy Father stated, "Hence, the august Mother of God, mysteriously united from all eternity with Jesus Christ in one and the same decree of predestination, immaculate in her conception, a virgin inviolate in her divine motherhood, the wholehearted companion of the divine Redeemer who won complete victory over sin and its consequences, gained at last the supreme crown of her privileges — to be preserved immune from the corruption of the tomb, and like her Son, when death had been conquered, to be carried up body and soul to the exalted glory of heaven, there to sit in splendor at the right hand of her Son, the immortal King of the ages." (AAS, 769)

May our journeys of faith in this life bring us at last to the glory of the Kingdom gained for us by Mary's Son. May we enjoy the simple things of this journey here on earth and someday be united with Christ, bodies and souls, in His heavenly realm through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Georgine is retired from Wilmington Trust Bank and works part time for Earle's Tire Sales in New Castle, DE.



Since 1978, the Slovak Catholic Federation has been conducting the SS. Cyril and Methodius Appeal which begins each year in the month of February during the weekend closest to the Feast of SS. Cyril and Methodius (February 14th) and continues through the end of the calendar year. I am happy to report that \$30,686.30 has been collected to date for the 2008 Appeal.

In its 30th year, this appeal has primarily been taken up in parishes of Slovak heritage in the United States and Canada. As we are all very much aware, the days of "ethnic parishes" are becoming a thing of the past. More and more Slovaks reside in different parts of the country and no longer claim to belong to a parish of Slovak heritage. For this reason, many Slovaks may not have the opportunity to hear about, let alone participate in this Annual Appeal. If it were not for the Slovak Catholic fraternal societies and their publications, communication to American and Canadian Slovaks would not be possible. In recent years we have seen an increase in individual donations apart from the parish collections. Also, most of the Slovak fraternal societies have also been making contributions to this collection from their National Boards of Directors, along with a number of local branches, wreaths, assemblies, and lodges.

As you know, this appeal assists the Church in Slovakia by supporting the training mission of the Pontifical Slovak College of SS. Cyril and Methodius in Rome, Italy (formally known as the Slovak Institute or *Ustav*). In addition, funds are distributed to those religious communities of both men and women that share a counterpart which belongs to the Slovak Conference of Religious. These communities are: Vincentian Sisters of Charity (*Ruzomberok*); Dominican Sisters (*Dunajska Luzna*); School Sisters of St. Francis (*Zilina*); Daughters of St. Francis *Bratislava-Prievoz*); Byzantine Catholic Sisters of St. Basil the Great (*Secove and Presov*); Franciscan Friars Minor (*Bratislava*); and House of St. Benedict (*Bacurov*).

As various groups will be holding summer picnics along with several fraternal national conventions, I ask that consideration be given to kindly taking up a collection in support of the Slovak Catholic Federation Appeal. All donations are tax deductible. In 2007 this Annual Appeal totaled around \$63,629.51.
