Reflections

Very Reverend Monsignor Peter M. Polando, D. Min., J.C.L., National Chaplain

Ah, it is that month, when the beginning of the new school year quickly becomes a reality! However, when I was a child, and in many instances today, the school year did/does not begin until the Tuesday after Labor Day because our Mahoning County Fair (one of the largest county fairs in the State of Ohio) annually commenced the Thursday prior the Labor Day weekend. It is a wonderful event that was/is well attended and was/ is always a mixture of farming and

city flavors that continued to make the fair better and better each and every year! This year is the one hundredth seventy-seventh celebration known graciously as the Canfield Field Fair and its long-time symbol has been that of a male chicken with the words surrounding it - "The Canfield Fair: Something to Crow About!" There are still competitions with the local grown fruits and vegetables, the accomplishments obtained in the various Four H categories, animal competitions, various races, and a variety of entertainments, especially in the evenings, for the people's entertainment. The fair portrays those who have worked so hard on their labors and observers who view the workers accomplishments with pride on both sides of the barnvard fence - laborers and adorers! But when the festivities of the six-day event ends, that Tuesday is the start of the new academic year! Some schools in the county have already been in session several weeks prior the fair. But now begins the challenge of ongoing academic achievements, sporting events, physically and mentally achieving higher goals, and gaining more knowledge that is retained throughout the school year and the rest of their lives!

I cherished my grade and high school years! I was not the brightest student at the end of my twelfth academic year (I graduated forty-third in a class of 496) and my stature did not afford me the opportunity to participate in sports (I was the ninety-eight pounds weakling and the second lowest boy in height)! But I still had the motivation from the second grade onward to become a priest and here I am today some forty-three plus years in my presbyterate.

During my childhood, there was an advertisement on the radio and television stations that reminded parents and students alike that the school year was about to commence. When I was a child, there was a local clothing store named *Robert Hall*. I do not recall if it was just a local store or one that was throughout our state or states. When the school year was about to start in the prior month, I remember their little jingle on the radio and television stations singing, "School bells ringing, children singing 'it's back to Robert Hall again'". However, I had a disdain for the little, melodic song, knowing that we young people



were going to have to endure still the lingering summer heat in the classrooms and begin the old grind again. I was reminded of this song several years ago, when one of the major retail stores in the United States took on the same strategy on the television stations with parents sliding in the grand store, picking out school clothing, supplies, and other necessities for the upcoming school year as they were singing, "It's the most wonderful time of the year" throughout the entire

advertisement. My feelings went out to the children!

I did like school in the long run and am so very happy that I grew up with wonderful parents and two guarding, older brothers. In addition, I grew up with the presence of God in my life. There were three prayers that I learned I believe in the third grade that enhance my relationship with God and with myself through my days of education and the days of my priesthood up to the present. It got me through many times when I felt distance from God, my family, or my friends. Most importantly, it strengthened my relationship with them to this very day. The prayers are as follows:

An Act of Faith. O my God, I firmly believe that You are One God in three Divine Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; I believe that Your Divine Son became one like us, and died for our sins, and that He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe these and all the truths which the Holy Catholic Church teaches because You have revealed them, Who can neither deceive nor be deceived.

An Act of Hope. O my God, relying on Your almighty power and infinite mercy and promises, I hope to obtain pardon of my sins, the help of Your grace, and life everlasting, through the merits of Jesus Christ, my Lord and Redeemer.

An Act of Love. O my God, I love You above all things, with my whole heart and soul, because You are all-good and worthy of all my love. I love my neighbor as myself for the love of You. I forgive all who have injured me and ask pardon of all whom I have injured.

And each evening I learned to ask for God's forgiveness:

O My God, I am heartily sorry for having offended You, and I detest all my sins because of the loss of heaven and pains of hell, but most of all because they offend You, my God, Who are all-good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Your grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasions of sin.

The Lessons of being a good Catholic: have Faith in God; do not give up on Hope in God; Love God with your entire self while loving others; and, ask for God's forgiveness and the forgiveness of others.

BEST POTATO SALAD

2¹/₂ pounds Yukon gold potatoes

- 1 cups mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup refrigerated sweet pickle relish
- 1/2 tablespoons yellow mustard
- 1/2 tablespoons dijon mustard
- 1/2 tablespoon apple cider vinegar
- 1/2 tablespoon celery seeds
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika
- 3 hard boiled eggs, peeled and chopped 2 celery stalks, diced
- 1/4 cup sweet onion, diced
- 1/4 tablespoon fresh chopped dill Salt and pepper

Cut the potatoes into quarters and place them in a large stockpot. Fill the pot with cold water until it is 1 inch over the top of the potatoes. Set the pot over high heat and bring to a boil. Once boiling, add 1 tablespoon salt and cook the potatoes for 13-15 minutes, until fork tender.

Meanwhile, in a medium bowl mix the mayonnaise, sweet pickle relish including juices, mustard, apple cider vinegar, celery seeds, paprika, 1 teaspoon salt, and pepper to taste. Stir until smooth. Then chop the eggs, celery, onions, and dill.

Once the potatoes are very tender, drain off all the water. Remove the loose peels and chop the potatoes into 1/2-inch chunks. It's okay if they are soft and crumbly. Place the potatoes in a large bowl. Gently mix in the dressing until it coats the potatoes well. Then stir in the eggs, celery, onions, and dill. Taste, then salt and pepper as needed. Garnish with fresh dill and paprika.

Cover the potato salad and refrigerate for at least 4 hours. It tastes even better on day two! Keep refrigerated in an airtight container for up to one week.

BROCCOLI BEEF KEBABS

2 lbs. tri-tip steak boneless (or beef brisket) cut into 11/2" chunks 24 broccoli florets 1 large sweet onion cut into $1\frac{1}{2}$ " chunks 1/3 cup soy sauce low sodium 1/4 cup brown sugar

4 cloves garlic minced

- 2 tablespoon rice vinegar
- 1 teaspoon sesame oil
- 1 tablespoon honey
- 1 tablespoon ketchup
- 1 teaspoon sesame seeds garnish

2 tablespoon chopped green onions garnish Cut steak into 11/2" cubes and place in a large storage bag or bowl.

In a small bowl, whisk together minced garlic, soy sauce, brown sugar, vinegar, and sesame oil. Reserve about a third of this sauce in the fridge for basting later.

Pour remaining marinade over steak cubes and toss to fully coat. Cover and place steak in the fridge to let marinade for at least 4 hours up to overnight.

Skewer the kabobs using 3 pieces of steak, 3 broccoli florets, and 3 slices of onion.

Take the reserve marinade and whisk in ketchup and honey.

Heat your grill to medium heat.

Add skewers to the hot grill, turning every 2-3 minutes to cook all sides evenly for a total of about 15 minutes. During the last few turns, baste with sauce.

When done, skewers will have nice char marks and meat will be tender (about 145-150 degrees for a medium cook). If you prefer them more well done, leave on for a bit longer.

Serve kebabs with a sprinkle of sesame seeds and chopped green onions. Makes approximately 8.

STRAWBERRY

RHUBARB CRISP

- 1 pound rhubarb, cut into 1-inch cubes 1 pound strawberries, hulled and quartered 3/4 cup granulated sugar 1¹/₂ tablespoons cornstarch 1 teaspoon vanilla extract Topping 1 cup all-purpose flour 1/2 cup brown sugar 1/4 cup granulated sugar 1/2 teaspoon salt 1 cup rolled oats quick-cooking
- 1/2 cup butter unsalted (1 stick or 8 tablespoons), softened

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Add all the filling ingredients to a large bowl and toss well. Pour the fruit mixture into an ungreased 8x11-inch baking dish.

In a medium size bowl add the flour, brown sugar, granulated sugar, salt and rolled oats. Toss with a spatula until well combined. Add the butter and stir using a spatula or a pastry cutter until well combined and crumbly. Sprinkle the topping over the fruit evenly.

Transfer the baking dish to the oven and bake for 1 hour, until the fruit is bubbling and the topping is golden brown.

Serve warm with vanilla ice cream.

BLUEBERRY COBBLER

4 cups blueberries fresh or frozen

- 2 tablespoon all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup sugar granulated
- 1 tablespoon lemon zest
- 1¹/₂ cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt or to taste
- 1/2 cup sugar granulated
- 2 teaspoon baking powder
- 6 tablespoon butter, unsalted, cold,
- cut into tablespoon sized pieces
- 1¹/₄ cup half and half

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees.

Toss the blueberries with the 2 tablespoons of flour, sugar, and lemon zest in a medium bowl. Pour the blueberries into an 8 or 9 inch square baking dish.

Whisk the flour, salt, sugar, and baking powder together in a large mixing bowl. Add the butter and cut it into the flour mixture using a pastry blender or two knives until a crumbly consistency forms.

Add the half and half and mix just until the ingredients are moistened. Use a spoon to drop dollops of dough over the blueberries.

Transfer the pan to the oven and bake for 35-40 minutes, or until the top is golden brown and the blueberries are bubbly. Serve with a sprinkle of powdered sugar or a scoop of vanilla ice cream.

RED SANGRIA

750 ml red wine one bottle, Garnacha or Pinot Noir.

1 cup orange juice

- 1/2 cup brandy or cognac
- 1/2 cup simple syrup (OPTIONAL: if you
- want your sangria sweet)
- 1 lemon sliced into slices, then each slice into guarters
- 1 large orange sliced into slices, then each slice into quarters
- 2 cups berries: strawberries, cherries, raspberries, blueberries, and/or blackberries

Add all the ingredients to a large pitcher and stir well to combine.

Add ice either to the pitcher, or pour the sangria over individual glasses of ice to avoid watering down the pitcher.
